

National Curriculum.

The National Curriculum for Primary Schools sets out what is expected to be taught to children from 4-11 years across a range of statutory curriculum subjects. In Key Stage 1, these subjects are:

Mathematics
English
Science
Computing
Physical Education
Geography
History
Art and Design
Music
Design and Technology

As well as these subjects our school teaches Religious Education in line with the Durham Agreed Syllabus. Work within RE covers major elements of Christianity and a variety of other world religions such as Buddhism.

We also focus upon Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education across the school as we believe that the skills, attitudes and behaviours that are developed are essential to a happy and successful school life, and as a preparation for the wider world in which the children will live.

We aim to make all elements of our curriculum as engaging and interesting as possible in order to gain the maximum benefits for our children. A range of teaching and learning styles and techniques are used and children are encouraged to become independent and confident learners from an early age. It is our belief that our curriculum is one where learning should be fun, relevant and stimulating so that children are fully engaged and want to learn!
